Academic Ethics and Integrity Education Implementation Guidelines

Passed on the 2015 Academic Year Sixth Department Affairs Meeting on June 16, 2016

Revision passed on the 2018 Academic Year Fourth Department Affairs Meeting on March 21, 2019

- I. In order to enhance the research ethics of master's and doctoral students and improve their cognition and attitudes of academic ethics and integrity education, the Department develops the "Academic Ethics and Integrity Education Implementation Guidelines" (hereinafter referred to as the Guidelines) according to the "Academic Ethics and Integrity Education Implementation Guidelines" of the University.
- II. The subjects of the Guidelines are master's students, in-service master's program students, and doctoral students.
- III. Master's and PhD programs' students in day school are required to complete the academic ethics and integrity education and pass the evaluation in the course of "Academic Orientation and Professional Development". Master student in in-service master's program must finish academic ethics and integrity education and pass the evaluation in the course of "Studies in Psychology".
- IV. Students can choose one of the following ways to take "academic ethics and integrity education" course:
 - (1) Take all courses in "core modules for graduate students" by "Center for Taiwan Academic Research Ethics Education".
 - (2) Take online or in-person courses recognized by Academic Ethics and Integrity Committee's Academic Research Integrity Training Team of the University, fulfill all of the requirements of the chosen courses.
- V. Issues not mentioned in the Guidelines shall be handled in accordance with the "Academic Ethics and Integrity Education Implementation Guidelines" of the University.
- VI. The Guidelines shall take effect with the approval of the Department Affairs Committee. Any amendments thereafter must be handled in the same manner.

These guidelines were translated from the original Chinese. In the event of any discrepancies between the two versions, the Chinese always takes precedence.
